Treasurer's/Finance Committee Report from May 18, 2023

SEPIA Finance Committee Meeting Minutes for 5/18/2023

Meeting opened with Serenity Prayer at 7:00 pm; Attendance: Jim B. (Treasurer), Stephanie W. (Asst Treasurer), Jay F. (vice chairperson), Steve S (Dir of Public Information), Andrea (Bucks Co zone coordinator), Patrick M. (Phila liaison), Steve Mc (Chester liaison), Greg (Mont Co liaison), Janet C (Delaware Co liaison), Chris B (Bucks Co liaison), Elaine J (member)

- I. Meeting opened at 7 pm with the Serenity Prayer and Introductions
- II. Read and discussed Tradition 7 and Concept 7
- III. Reviewed Financial Reports: Monthly Income Statement (P&L), Year-to-Date Income Statement, Balance Sheet

A. April 2023 Income Statement (P&L):

- 1. Total income is lower than budgeted, some of the income appears to be not posted to the correct accounts. The round up figures are still being finalized.
- 2. Cost of goods sold is higher than budgeted. This may be due to the round up costs coming in higher than anticipated, but without the corresponding income to compare to, it's hard to say. Round up figures are still being finalized.
- 3. Committee and zone spending is low, timing differences may be an issue as it appears the interphones committee had no phone bill in April. Expecting a pick up in May after round up.
- 4. Office expenses and salaries are slightly lower than budgeted.

B. Year-To-Date (11/2022 - 04/2023) Income Statement:

- 1. Total income is lower than budgeted, some of the income appears to be not posted to the correct accounts. The round up figures are still being finalized. Literature sales are 19% higher than budgeted, which may be due to an increase since COVID, and also due to an April price increase.
- 2. Total cost of goods sold is 19% higher than budgeted, some of this is due to the catch up of literature costs owed to AAWS for prior year sales, there are likely higher costs for the round up than budgeted. The round up figures are still
- 3. being finalized.

- 4. Committee and zone spending is below budget. CPC has no spending so far YTD that has been reported. At the half way point of the year, it would be good for committees to review their budgets and spend their funds as they intended
- 5. during the budget process.
- 6. Negative miscellaneous expenses to be looked into
- 7. Office expenses are lower than budgeted due to not incurring some expenses such as computer consultants, computer equipment/lease and professional services.
- 8. Payroll taxes look to be overstated while compensation is understated, overall it is 89% of budgeted amounts. Line item reclassifications may be needed to accurately report amounts.

C. Balance Sheet:

- 1. Franklin Mint plus Money Market funds will be making up our prudent reserve.
- 2. Negative round up deposits of \$18K are likely round up income and need to be reclassified as such.
- 3. A few anomalies in accounts receivable, offset and accounts payable to be reviewed internally.
- IV. Office Manager Report: Fran not present
- V. Open Discussion
 - A. Committee meeting visitation no formal commitments were made
 - B. Committee members contributed to discussion regarding financial institutions where we may receive a higher rate of interest on our prudent reserve funds.
 - C. Discussion regarding what to do with group funds when they are consistently at an excess of their expenditures. Does it make a difference if it is a meeting at a club house?
 - D. Updates to email addresses were made to ensure that all liaisons and alternate liaisons can have access to the monthly reports.

I. Open with Serenity Prayer, Welcome & Introductions

II. UNFINISHED BUSINESS

1. Round Up Debrief: Steve S.

Great time, workshop did not have a great turnout. Lots of people came to the table - gave out clergy and senior center packets.

2. Senior Outreach Campaign and HUSHH Update: Steve S.

Well over six months. People have gotten positive reactions from staff when distributing these. I will show people what is in the packet. People are very happy to get these. One person wondered what one has to do to sign-up, which is a reasonable question. We also can mail the packets to people. Steve will have packets mailed to John H.

In the packet is a HUSHH flyer so senior centers have the option of trying to secure HUSHH service.

3. Faith Leaders Campaign: Steve S.

Faith leaders' pamphlet replaced the pamphlet directed to clergy. However, the faith leader pamphlets are out. We are using the old clergy ones for the time being.

4. Radio Stations directory formation and outreach: Emma S.

PI committee has obtained contact information for radio stations in the 5 county area. Steve has been emailing stations to see if they want to play PSA's. We have heard reports that the PSA's are being played. We need to continue to inform people that PSA's are approved by the General Service Conference and have been since the 1960's. Jeff suggests that we could have a blurb in the interviews and the Grapevine because this is also an issue that comes up at the General Service.

The national PICPC Working group is putting on a program for AA members on June 21 on the topic of Tradition 11. Powerful Speakers are being lined up.

5. University Contact list: Sam H (Philadelphia Liaison) Review the 'Educator' e-flyer here.

Trying to get to Universities and get them information. We will start outreach in August. Do we just take a packet? What should we tell them that we want to do? Do we just email stuff, or try to talk to someone. What is the best way to approach the Universities? John - a combination of both, how you pitch might from one to another is to have a sheet with key bullet points to discuss in any situation - topics to touch on when reaching out. Steve - AA has a You Tube Channel there are conference approved videos directed to young people. We can keep in mind - a link to give to a guidance counselor - First came to mind the Residence Assistants - the folks who are students - the RA would know about it could post flyers or QR for the Young Tube - ask the youth side of AA ... Scott is very involved Bucks YPAA we can ask him about that.

6. Lamar Billboard

We rented 5 billboards one in each county for Memorial Day or 4th of July. NOt turning out as simple as as hoped. They can't give us a price until just before the billboard goes up.

Jeff would like to work with us and find out who the contact is. Steve - we looked at a few different companies, Jeff - economies of scale works better. I'm concerned with Montgomery and Central Bucks - billboards co-fund. Rocky - could we do a plane that goes by the shore. Rocky will look into this.

Google Business Profile - Google creates a Google Business page for any business with a physical address. We claimed ours. We were able to put our information on it. One of the things we do is ask homegroups photos of those meetings, Google analytics thinks it's a good idea to send more people to our page when we post these photos. This causes more people to call the office and go to the web page more frequently - Google has changed the way it operates, so it is not as easy to get a sense of how many people are viewing the photos.

Sam - some of the text explaining what Sepia is, and is not, is out of date. Google Business Profiles (GBP): a free listing for all businesses with a brick-and-mortar presence. Claiming ownership of the profile enables us to control the information presented to people using Google Search and Maps.

Sam claimed the profile for SEPIA and was the owner and one of the managers of SEPIA's profile pictures posted on SEPIA's profile. One month we garnered 40,000 views of our pictures/posts.

Sam - if we post ourselves in a sub-category as a treatment center we will come up if someone googles treatment centers.

Google Ads

Google will grant non-profits up to \$10,000 a month worth of ads when certain keywords are used. General Service Conference approved AAWS uses. SEPIA can use this to cause keywords in an Internet search to bring more people to our site. SEPIA is set up to use this, but Google requires changes to our website. Once we revamp our website we can use campaigns based on key words to utilize Google Ads for aasepia.org.

Also looking for webtech volunteers who have experience with Word Press.

Other New Business - Jeff wants to work an approach to combine resources to better leverage AA messages. Steve and Jeff will connect.

SEPIA Special Events Committee Meeting Minutes 05/29/2023

Memorial Day "Virtual BBQ" Meeting called to order at 7:01. Jay led with Rich as Zoom host. In attendance: Jay, Lorraine, Dave, Fred S., Sharon, Suzanne, Jimmy, Peggy H., Bebe, Nick P., Mike Q., Bonnie B., Rich M., Chris C., Nick M., Bill S., Lynn M., Rebecca, Elaine J., Kevin B., Andrea S. & Jon R. (22 in total)

- Opened with Serenity Prayer
- Attendees introduction conducted with name, home group and anniversaries noted.
- Prior month's minutes were discussed; no comments or amendments identified. Minutes were motioned for acceptance, seconded and accepted by all.
- Gratitude Breakfast –
 o Two potential venues presented by Jay Springfield Country Club and Cannstatters

- Many others have not responded to requests for quote/availability
- Price will be higher this year, probably closer to \$30/person
- o Fred commented that Cannstatters is where the dinner-dance used to be held
- o Dave suggested Cannstatters has ample parking
- o Kevin suggested public access better at Cannstatters
- BINGO Event
 - o Nick M. attended the meeting to present his experience with other BINGO events
 - Option of old school hopper or use of downloaded app w/projector or monitor
 - Order BINGO cards in bulk w/markers
 - Past events had as many as 80 attendees but smaller turnout (~40) this year
 - Cards were sold 10 for \$8
 - Each round was different, whole card was the final round
 - Last year they did a potluck lunch followed by BINGO on Saturday afternoon
 - o Suzanne also shared that she had been involved in several large BINGO events
 - Bulk card order ensures no duplicate cards; can order color-coded cards so each round can be easily separated
 - Knows someone who has the whole set-up and will ask if they would rent it to SEPIA
 - Will also check with her home group meeting space to see if it is available
 - o September timeframe proposed for the BINGO event
- Round-Up
 - o Jay presented the survey responses with details
 - 75% had attended previous Rus
 - 84% did not enjoy the banquet
 - \$50 too high for quality of food based on comments
 - 53% attended workshops
 - Suggestions to space the workshops out more)
 - 64% did not attend Al-Anon session
 - 96% did not attend Hispanic session
 - 66% attended peer meetings
 - 54% did not attend long-timers session
 - 88% liked the karaoke event (big hit!)
 - 83% liked the ice cream social
 - Negative comments about the wait time, however
 - 70% appreciated the walk-run
 - 82% liked the coffee
 - Double the quantity of coffee supplies used
 - 8% liked the hospitality room
 - 20% intend to return next year
 - Many noted that they prefer it to be at another venue

o 2023 Round-Up Results and Overall Feedback:

- ~1,100 attendees
- \$20K profit for SEPIA
- 67% online-registered, 6% by phone, remainder in person
- Many attendees stated at another venue as Showboat sold out on the room block; could have used another 100 rooms for sure
- Facility deficiencies noted escalators, elevators
- Large venue lots of walking
- Survey indicates a shore destination as a strong group preference

o Jay has initiated conversations with The Grand for 2024

 Weekend following Easter is the likely date-UPDATE Grand rescinded April Date and offered Early March Dates

o Jay commented that we need to start planning for beyond 2024 and need volunteers to assist with that effort

- At a minimum, need to nail down the date and venue for 2024
- Consider other shore venues
- Consider other non-shore venues
- o Sharon asked if there was a max distance to take into account for future RU events
- o Dave suggested that if The Grand is selected for 2024, need to ask about better space to serve as hospitality suite
- o Jimmy added that the survey responses aligned with his own experience, which has prompted him to attend Special Events meetings
- o Ashley suggested extending the speaker time so speakers were less rushed (long-timers panel)
- o Suzanne asked to make note that the schedule for karaoke should be pushed back by 30 minutes to allow for set-up
- o Rich expresses his tanks for the hard work this year, is happy that The Grand is back in the running for 2024 but admits a better venue than The Grand is needed (i.e. larger)
- o Jay mentioned his expectation that room rates and banquet expenses will very likely be higher for 2024 but is hoping to negotiate the banquet price down.
- Motion was made to close the meeting, which was seconded and passed with no abstentions.
- Meeting adjourned with the "Responsibility Pledge" at approximately 8:00pm
